Committee name: REGULATION AND CONDUCT COMMITTEE ('the Committee')

Details of IP: Daniel Plant, of London, formerly an Insolvency Practitioner

Association (IPA) member and Licensed Insolvency Practitioner.

Summary of complaint: This Order is made in relation to a complaint that Mr Plant, in his role

as liquidator of a company, breached the Fundamental Principle of Professional Competence and Due Care of the Insolvency Code of

Ethics, when he:

a) Failed to respond to correspondence from the company's

pensions administrator; and

 Failed to ensure complete and accurate Forms RP15 and RP15A were submitted to the Redundancy Payments Service as

appropriate prior to the closure of the case.

Accordingly, Mr Plant was found liable to disciplinary action under the

IPA's Articles of Association.

Summary of sanctions: The Common Sanctions Guidance provides for a starting point of a

Severe Reprimand and a financial sanction of £5,000 for a serious breach of the Fundamental Principle of Professional Competence and

Due Care.

The Committee imposed a disciplinary order that Mr Plant be

Severely Reprimanded and fined £5,000.
