Deputy Chief Inspector Vacancy

The Insolvency Practitioners Association (IPA) is developing and expanding its insolvency monitoring team and would be pleased to receive applications from anyone interested in the compliance field as a full time Inspector. The role of Deputy Chief Inspector is a key role and an applicant needs to demonstrate leadership qualities. Along with helping manage the inspection team, the applicant will need to have an interest in being actively involved in regulatory change and in ensuring that the IPA meets its regulatory objectives.

The Deputy Chief Inspector (DCI) will play a key role in the IPA's regulatory objectives which include developing professional and ethical standards and also protecting and promoting the public interest by dealing promptly with an act or omission by an insolvency practitioner which is serious enough to cause harm to the public, brings the reputation of the insolvency industry into disrepute by reducing public confidence or fails to uphold proper standards of conduct and performance.

A key part of the role is to conduct monitoring visits for insolvency practitioners to check standards and performance. Visits are either conducted in their offices or increasingly these are being conducted remotely to review files and check on compliance with the laws, rules and ethics of practice in insolvency and Anti-Money Laundering. Visits involve interviewing practitioners and key members of staff, reviewing systems and preparing reports for consideration by the IPA's Regulation & Conduct Committee which assesses a practitioner's fitness to practise. Inspectors also regulate registered property receivers.

The DCI will be based at home and whilst much of the role can increasingly be conducted remotely the role will eventually require travel extensively around the UK in order to conduct some of the visits, completing around 25 remote or onsite visits per year. Typically, a visit takes between two and four days.

We are looking for someone who is self-sufficient and self-motivating, able to manage and prioritise their own work, whilst collaborating across the team and other members of the regulation department. During inspections you will be the IPA's primary contact with a practitioner and it is therefore important to have the ability to form firm but co-operative professional relationships with practitioners and from time to time deal diplomatically with potentially contentious issues. From visiting so many practices, you will gain an unrivalled experience of the different ways various practitioners work and often be in a position to assist practitioners by sharing knowledge. The job also offers an opportunity to contribute towards policy and practice within the IPA and the profession as a whole. A knowledge and experience of insolvency, law and compliance is essential.
